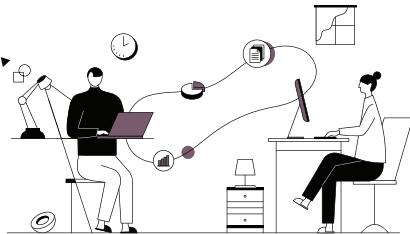

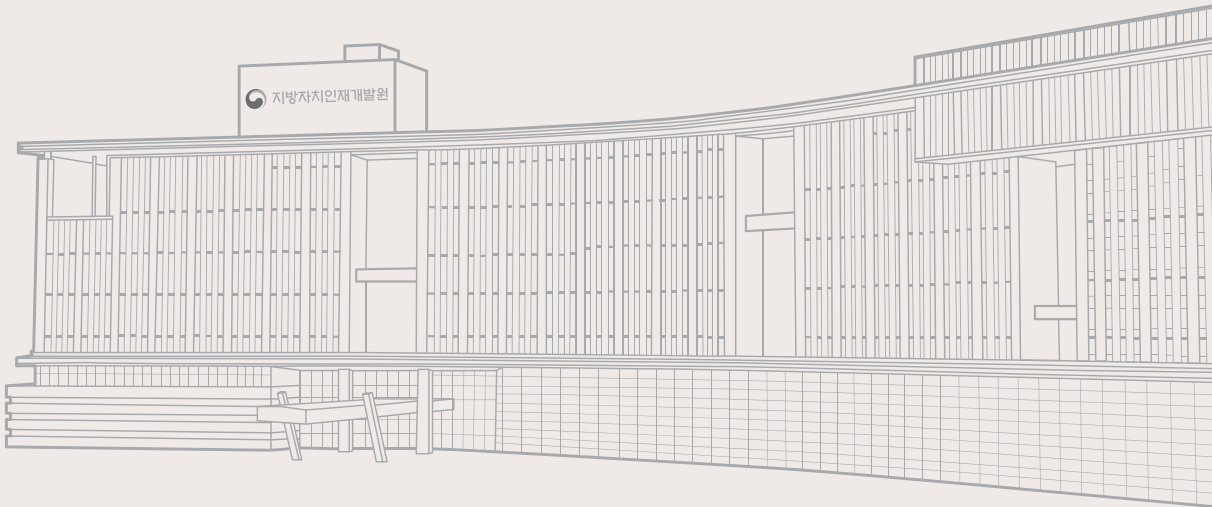

- 5 courses with about 360 officials for 10 months



Senior Policy Managers Course

Directors-General of high-level and Vice Heads of low-level local governments

- Fostering senior officials who lead a prosperous decentralization.
- Strategic thinking to strengthen local government competitiveness
- Balanced capacity with a vision, creativity, change, coaching, etc.



Senior Leaders Course

Directors of high-level and Directors-General of low-level local governments

- Fostering high ranking officials shaping the key vision and strategies of decentralization
- Leadership responding to the changes of the administrative environment
- Building capacity for integrated thought, planning, and coordination.



Mid-level Leaders Course

Team Leaders of high-level and Directors of low-level local governments

- Nurturing responsive mid-level officials through innovations in administration and leadership
- Balanced perspectives on the state and roles of government official
- Reinforcing policy actualization capabilities through problem-solving, case studies and engagement



Global Leaders Course

National Tasks Course

7 courses such as innovative development, sustainable future, etc.

Local Council Program

- Capacity Building for of local councils that lead decentralization
- 13 courses, 9 times, around 1,320 trainees, 1 to 5 days

Local Councilors Program

6 courses such as regional assembly academy, etc.

- Basic course: essential skills required for basic legislative activities
- Advanced course: advanced and in-depth skills per subject (administrative affairs auditing, budget examinations)
- Academy: Strengthening policy development capability by enhancing understanding about national key policy agendas and local issues
- Digital competency course: supporting the ICT-based communication skills and enhancing the local council management capacity



Basic Course for Councilors

Local Council Secretariats Program

7 courses including administrative training for secretariat officials

- Common course: basic common skills required for overall duties
- Specialized course: advanced training per subject to foster regional experts in assembly administration (statutes and regulation formulation & review, administrative affairs auditing, budget resolution review & audit, etc.)
- Policy secretariat course: strengthening practical skills and basic values
- Digital Competency course: strengthening the ICT-based research, analysis, etc. skills to support the council activities.



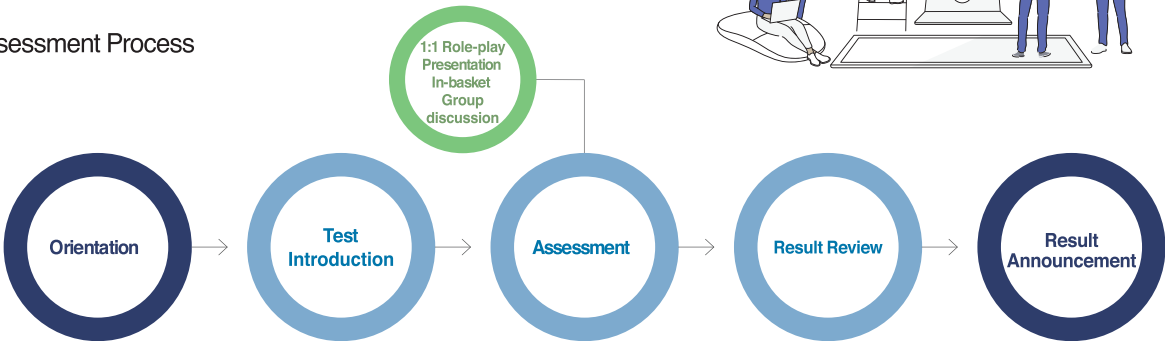

- To assess the leadership capacity of candidates to be promoted as directors-general or directors in metropolitan and provincial governments (participating 8 cities and provinces as of 2023)

• Assessment Process



Leadership Development Program

- 3-day training program for about 350 candidates to be promoted as directors-general or directors from metropolitan and provincial governments
- Special training for trainees of Long-term Program and New G5 Leaders Program
- Boosting the managerial capacity through case-based participatory practice training

- 429 courses, about 1,100,000 trainees

- Smart classrooms that develop digital competence and computer labs that provide a place of rest and information



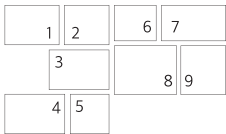

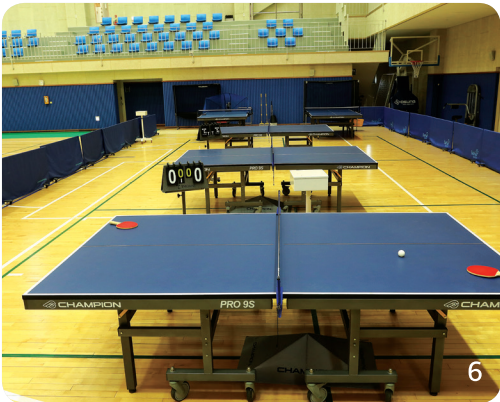
Multipurpose Studio Lecture Hall “Envision Studio”

Various Facilities

Library

- Library with a collection of over 110,000 books, policy publications, research papers from leading academic societies and research institutes, etc.

- A first-aid office with a range of medical equipment, medicines, first aid supplies, and recovery room

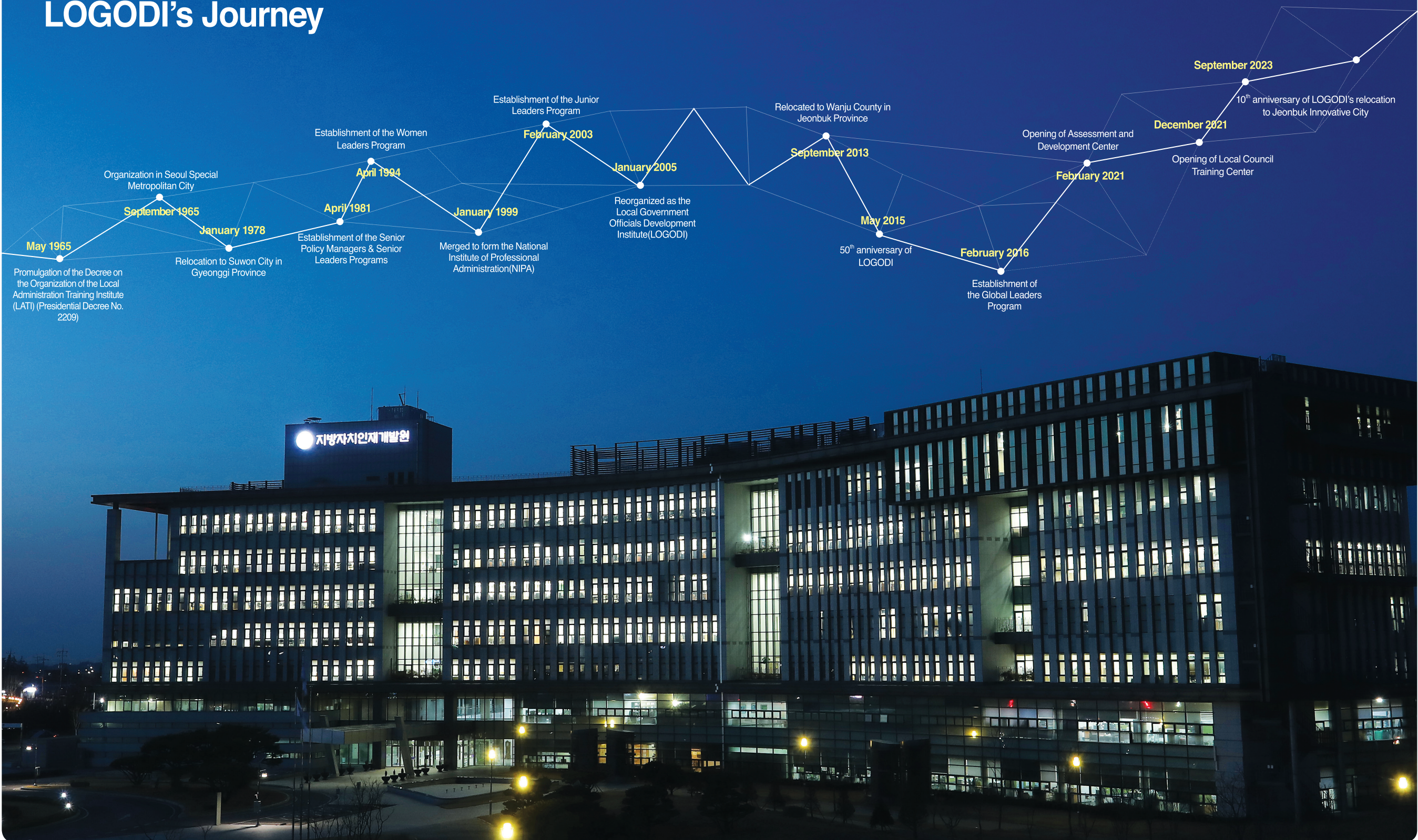
